As we go to press, we have over 425 children and counting, participating in our Summer Reading Program, Libraries Rock! We certainly were rocking at the Deer Park Public Library this summer. We had over 200 children and parents join us on the East Lawn for our kick off: an interactive concert with the Hip Pickles Drum Band. The Children's Room rolled with 145 children coming up for giveaways and to create a crafty tote.

Our teens and tweens are developing character and doing community service growing vegetables at the Town of Babylon's Edith Salzer Community Organic Garden to be donated to local food pantries. Others are volunteering by assisting with the myriad of programs the Children's Room offers. We are partnering with the district's summer school program by having ENL, English as a New Language, students visiting the Children's Room.

Children and caretakers are actively engaging in all our summer reading and learning experiences. We hope that you and your child participated with us this summer, but if you missed out, no worries, because the fun and learning continue as we rock and roll right into fall at your library.


