Lihrary has been utilizing RFID (Radio Frequency Identification) to circulate our library items.

RFID is the latest technology to be used in library theft detection systems. In

addition to better security the use of RFID reduces the amount of time required to perform circulation operations.

All of the tags used in RFID technology for libraries are "passive." The power to read the tags comes from the reader or exit sensor rather than from a hattery within the tag. The RFID readers are highly reliable Several vendors. of RFID library systems claim an almost 100 percent detection rate using RFID tags!

For patrons using self-checkout, there is a marked improvement because they do not have to carefully place materials within a designated template and they can checkout several items at the same time
