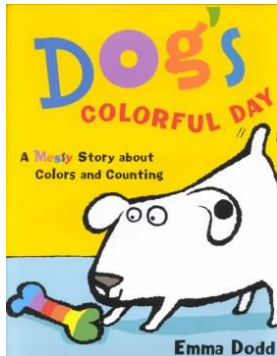


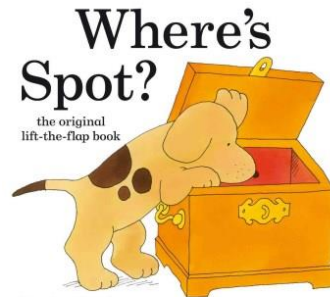

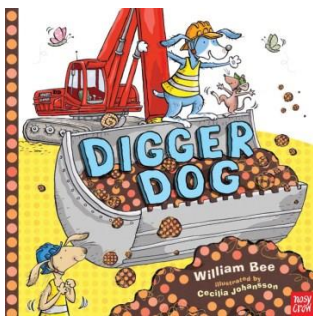
As he goes through the day, Dog gains an increasing number of differently colored spots on his previously white coat.

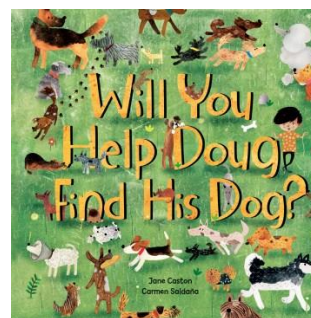

**One little, two little, three little puppies,**

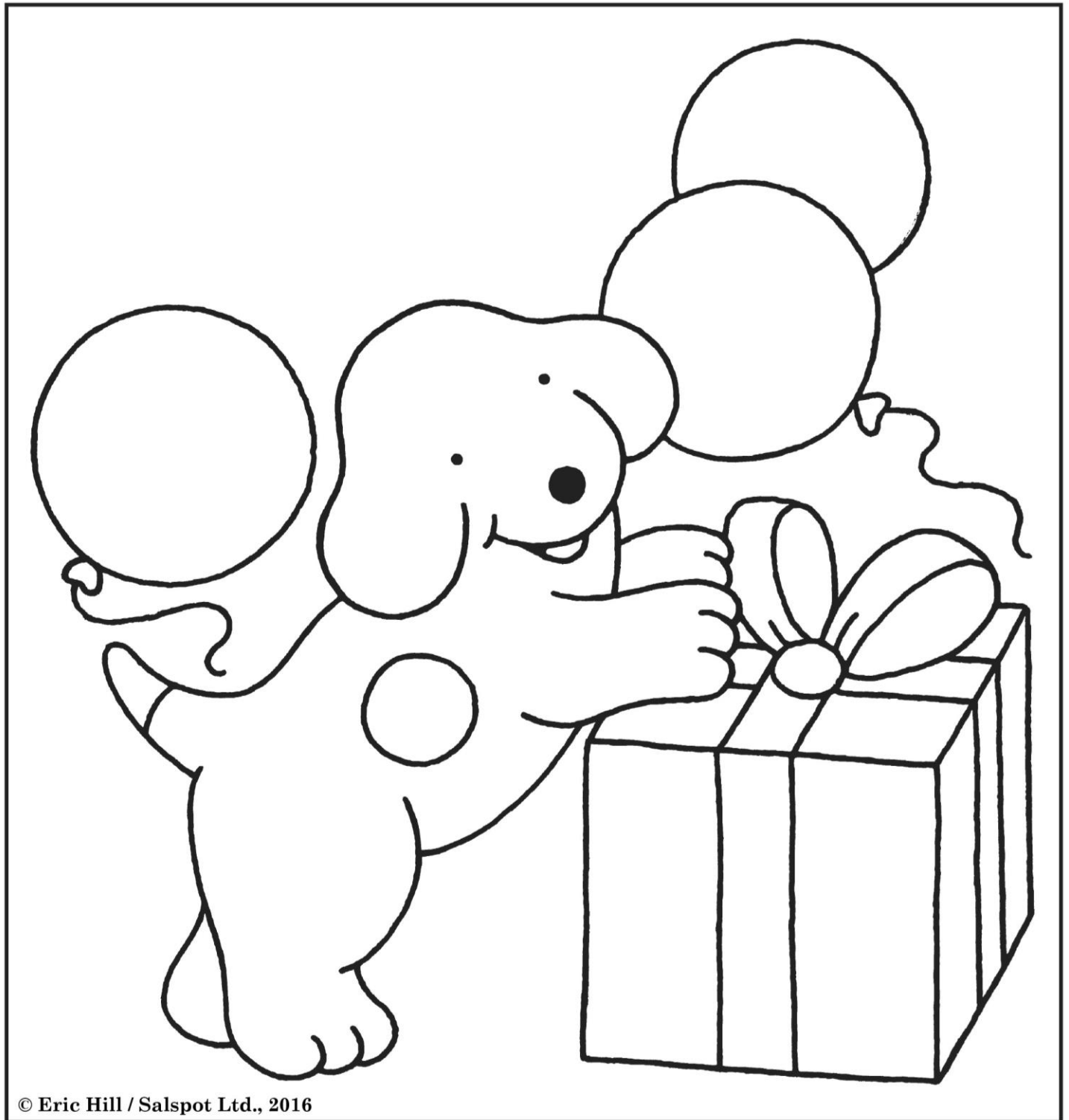
**Four little, five little, six little puppies,**
