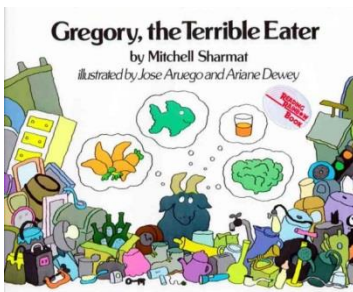

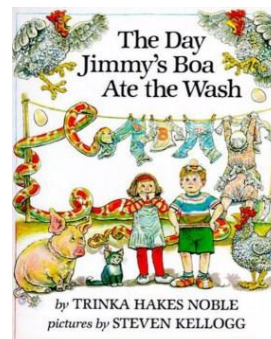

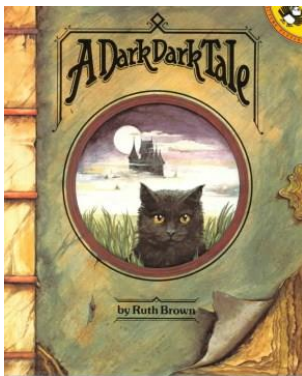

Gregory wants orange juice and eggs for breakfast and his parents are terribly upset! Why can't he eat striped ties and violins, like the rest of the goats? 1980



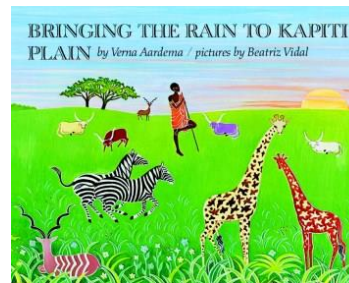

Jimmy's boa constrictor wreaks havoc on the class trip to a farm! 1980



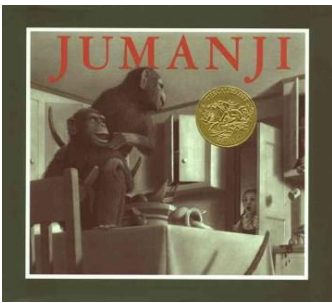

Journeying through a dark, dark house, a black cat surprises the only inhabitant of the abandoned residence. 1981



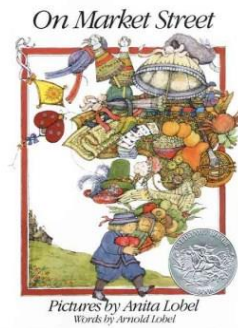

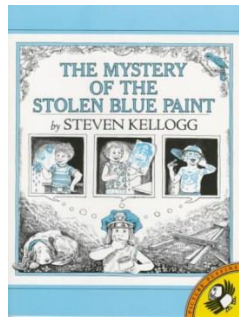

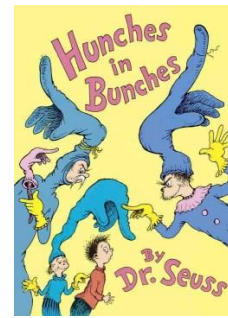

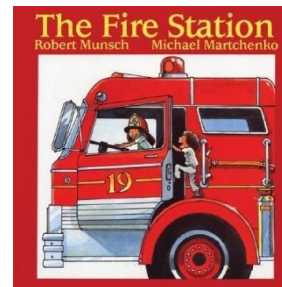

A boy has a difficult time making decisions even though there is a vocal bunch of Hunches to help him. 1982



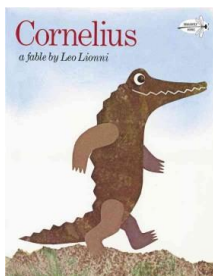

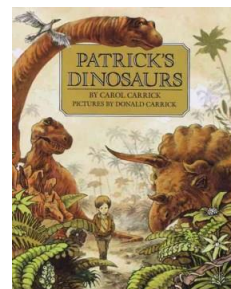

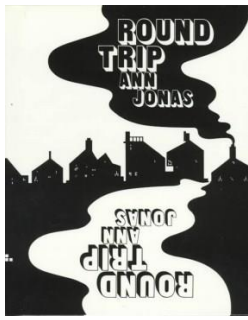

Unlike other crocodiles, Cornelius walks upright, sees things, and does tricks no other crocodile can. 1983



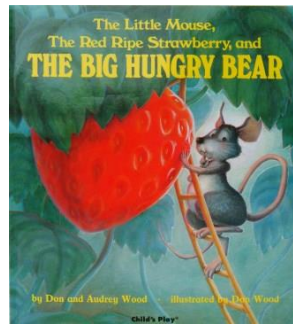

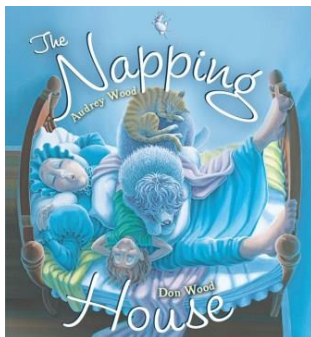

This book isn't just the story of a round trip--it is a round trip! Read forward and look at the sights, then flip the book over to see something different on the way back. 1983



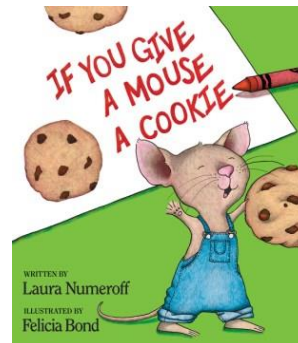

A restless flea manages to wake up everyone in the house who was sleeping, including a mouse, cat, dog, boy, and his grandmother. 1984



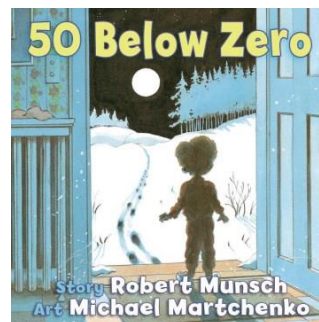

A young and very accommodating boy discovers you can never tell where it will stop if you give a lively, but demanding, mouse a cookie. 1985



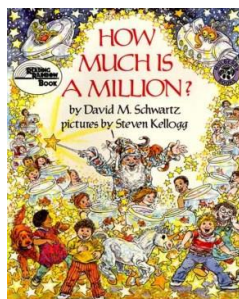

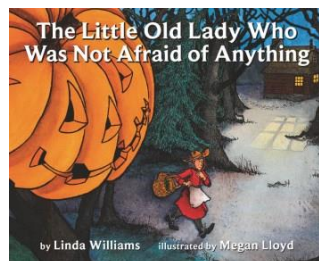

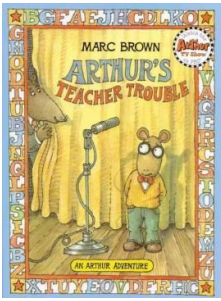

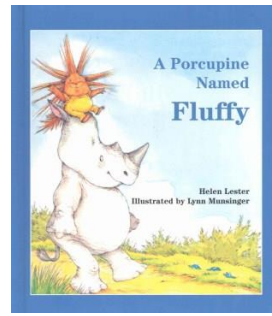

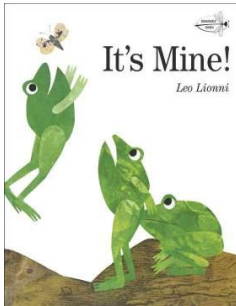

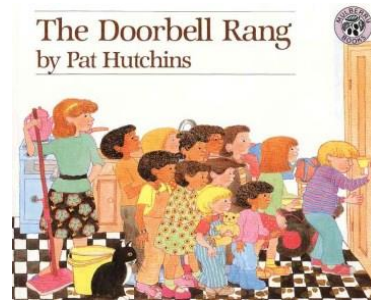

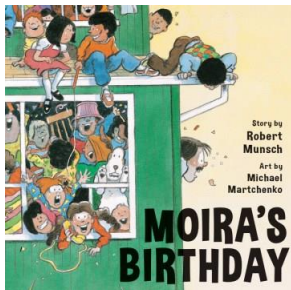

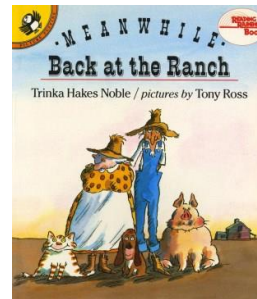

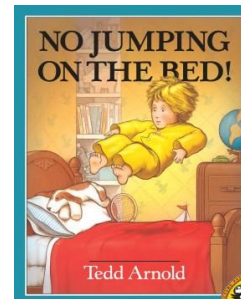

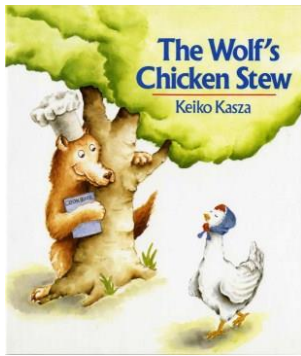

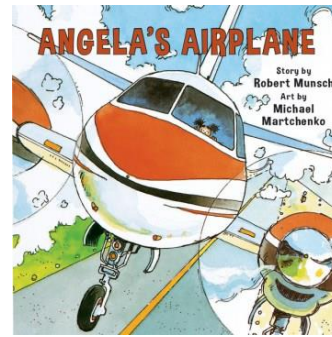

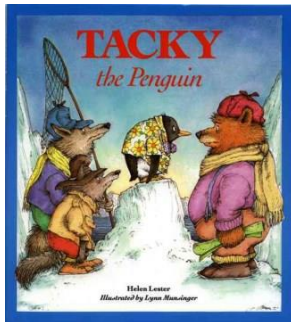

A hungry wolf's attempts to fatten a chicken for his stewpot have unexpected results. 1987



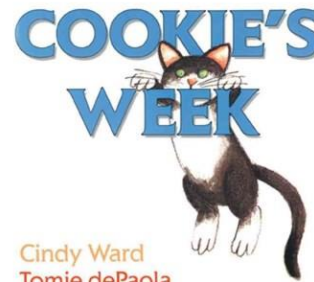

While looking for her lost father at the airport, Angela ends up in the front of the plane. She decides to push just one button, and then another... and another... 1988



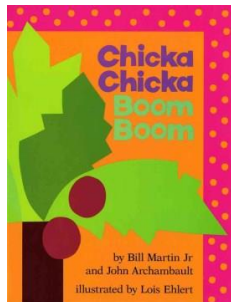

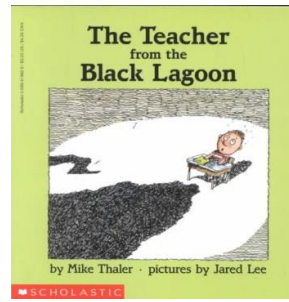

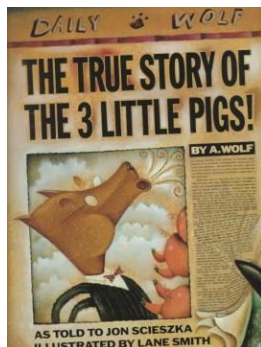
